

JOBSITE LOSS PREVENTION CHECKLIST

WATER DAMAGE PREVENTION

Assess the jobsite for potential water sources or flood zones and establish a wet work permit system.	Monitor weather forecasts to prepare for rain or snow and use temporary weatherproofing materials and/or water pumps as needed.
Consider adjusting the ground grading and drainage to help prevent water pooling.	Ensure water is shut off at the end of the workday and tools/equipment are properly stored.
Create a water damage response plan.Utilize water detection technology to monitor water flow, temperature, and moisture levels.	Inspect the jobsite regularly to monitor water and drainage, and test water systems for leaks and functionality.
FIRE PREVENTION	
HOUSEKEEPING	WELDING/HOT WORK
Provide a fire extinguisher, rated not less than 2A, for each 3,000 square feet of the protected building area. Travel distance from any point of the protected area to the nearest fire extinguisher shall not exceed 100ft.	Establish and enforce a formal hot work permit system.
	Thoroughly clean the hot work area of combustibles and flammables, wet down if possible and have a fire extinguisher present.
Remove combustibles from the building at the end of each workday and place in a noncombustible dumpster located at least 25ft	Stop all hot work two hours before end of day.
from structure.	TEMPORARY HEATING
Properly store flammable and combustible liquids in a UL approved safety container.	Use heaters in accordance with manufacturer's instructions.
Establish and enforce a no smoking policy.	Do not place temporary heaters close to combustible materials.
ELECTRICAL	NIGHTLY CLOSING CHECKS
A licensed electrician must install all temporary wiring.	Unplug all electrical items that are not needed.
☐ Inspect electrical cords regularly to ensure they are in good condition.	Check hot work areas.
THEFT PREVENTION	
Install perimeter fencing and limit the points of access to the jobsite.	Only deliver materials to jobsite as needed.
Install security lighting and video surveillance.	The last person leaving the site must lock all gates, doors, and windows.
Post signage stating the jobsite is under 24-hour surveillance and only authorized persons are allowed on site.	Remove all tools and materials from the site at end of day, or lock them in a conex box, trailer, or gang box.
